	Project is carried out within the First Team programme of the Foundation for Polish Science
Project description:	The main aim is to develop adaptive materials made of plasmonic and semiconductor nanocrystals for applications in photovoltaics and light emitting devices. We hypothesize that it is possible to combat current limitations of photonic devices by proper chemical functionalization of nanoparticles which would allow to: (i) deviate from the most widely investigated closed-packed symmetries of materials, (ii) achieve responsive materials with dynamically controlled structure and (iii) use responsive materials to prepare gradient and binary structures.

#### Data recipients
